WORKSHOPS

DEAR KITTY — Beginning with an introduction to Anne Frank and the diary she wrote while in hiding, students employ writing as a tool to explore their own challenges in school and their communities. The final project is a short diary with drawings that reflect their world.

THE ART OF SELF-DISCOVERY — Reflective, artistic, and expressive skills are polished on this journey to self-discovery, as students explore the power of being themselves. Final projects include self-portraits or journal writing, much as Anne did with her diary.

BYSTANDER TO ALLY — When the Frank family sought help to go into hiding, Miep Gies said "yes" without hesitation, putting her own life at risk to save others. This workshop enacts dramatic scenarios where students face choices, better understanding past and present, and empowering them to actively confront everyday oppression like bullying.
